
Background

On December 3, 2018, Dogwood Health Trust embarked on the first of eleven engagements with nonprofit leaders throughout Western North Carolina to listen and record their thoughts and opinions on issues impacting health. The engagements concluded on May 23, 2019, in Marion, NC. In total, there were 11 interactive thematic engagements involving 219 nonprofits and 226 participants resulting in 2,218 recorded responses. These responses have been synthesized for understanding, sharing, and growth.


The Phase I listening engagements introduced the first region-wide interaction between the Trust and nonprofit leaders across the regions of Western North Carolina. It is the beginning of a journey to identify community needs, resources, barriers, and opportunities. It is also a valuable source of information that will help shape understanding and ideas to advance the health and well-being of individuals, families, and communities of Western North Carolina.

You spoke and we listened – here is what we heard

- **SDOH Categories.** Approximately 1 in 4 responses to health impacts and issues were related to Neighborhood and Built Environment and Health and Healthcare excluding individual behavior and nonprofit organization issues and concerns. These were followed by Economic Stability, Social and Community Context, Education, and the Social Determinants of Health.



- **SDOH Determinants.** Healthcare was the top reported health determinant appearing in 8.1% of all responses followed by income, housing, transportation, community involvement, environment, and government. Collaboration and partnership accounted for more than 1 in 4 responses regarding factors that influence nonprofits followed by funding and support, efficient and effective, services and capacity, number of nonprofits, caring and trusting, and competing nonprofits.



- **SDOH Sub-Determinants.** Access, Opportunities, and Affordability led the list of sub-determinants appearing on 1 in 6 responses, followed by funding, collaboration, equity and inclusion, and quality.

5. Businesses and development (8.3%)
6. Workforce and employment (6.5%)

8. Churches & faith organizations (3.5%)

Barriers

1. Healthcare access & affordability (25.8%)
2. Income & living wage (12.9%)
3. Govt. agencies, laws & policies (11.1%)
4. Geography; rural vs. urban (8.9%)
5. Affordable and quality housing (7.0%)
6. Transportation; public and private (5.3%)
7. Education quality & affordability (5.8%)
8. Workforce and employment (4.8%)

- **Across the Regions of Western North Carolina**

- A broad array of factors influencing health were similarly reported across the different regions spanning socioeconomic conditions, health care, and the physical environment.
- Relative to the SDOH categories, the percent classification of aggregated responses between the various engagements and regions were consistent with a correlation of 0.96 or higher.

Conclusion

The Phase I Listening Engagement was successful in engaging and connecting nonprofit organizations and leaders and learning about their most important issues, concerns, and ideas. There was a high level of consistency in responses across the regions expressing a broad list of opportunities, influences, challenges, and barriers impacting the health and well-being of individuals, families, and communities of Western North Carolina.

Detailed Findings

Participants were asked the following questions regard health and the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH)¹:

1. What is unique about WNC that helps or gets in the way of addressing SDOH?
2. What are the strengths of this area?
3. What does a healthy community look like to you?
4. What are the roadblocks to a healthy community?


Responses were categorized using the following three grouping variables:

1. **SDOH Category:** Economic Stability, Education, Social and Community Context, Health and Healthcare, Neighborhood and Built Environment, SDOH, or Uncategorized.¹
2. **SDOH Determinant:** Factors that influence health such as income, early childhood development, social climate, healthcare, environment; making up a list of 44 total items.
3. **SDOH Sub-Determinant:** Strengths, challenges, and opportunities such as access, availability, funding, disparity, etc.; making up a list of 284 total items.


SDOH Determinants

Determinants are factors that influence health and well-being. The following lists represent the top health determinants and factors that influence the successful operation and impact of nonprofit organizations and communities.

Top 15 Nonprofit Factors




Healthcare, income, housing, transportation, and community involvement represent the top five health determinants while collaboration, funding, efficiency, service delivery and number of nonprofit organizations top the list of factors that influence nonprofit operations and impact.


When considering the environment along with its rural and natural beauty, there are significant and widespread challenges with infrastructure, broadband, and urban-rural disparities. The influence of local and state government agencies, along with laws and policies, reportedly play an important role in opportunities and health outcomes.

Top 20 Sub-Determinants





Access, Affordability, and Opportunities – Positive Factors and Challenges


The top five positive factors related to Access, Affordability, and Opportunities were health were Healthcare (14.5%), Education Attainment (14.5%), Healthy Food and Nutrition (11.7%), Housing (11.0%), and Resources (6.9%). The top five challenges were Healthcare (24.5%), Housing (21.9%), Transportation (13.0%), Healthy Food and Nutrition (8.7%), and Health Insurance (7.6%).

Across the Regions of Western North Carolina

The responses from each region were highly consistent when comparing SDOH categories. The ranking of SDOH categories was nearly identical.



Top WNC area strengths involved areas of the environment such as rural beauty and clean natural resources; social climate such as community, collaboration, innovation, creativity, and passion; and the abundant number of nonprofits and volunteer efforts in the region. In addition, quality schools, post-secondary education opportunities, healthy eating & lifestyles, nonprofit partnerships, population growth, diversity, neighborhoods, and local governments made up the top strengths reported.

Living wage, affordable housing, education opportunities, healthcare, and safe neighborhoods topped the sub-determinant attributes of a healthy community. Healthy lifestyles, access to healthy food, equity and inclusion, and social cohesion also ranked high. Addressing barriers such as access to mental health resources, providers, secure transportation, and employment opportunities ranked high along with personal attitudes and mindsets.

All five SDOH categories are represented with an emphasis on the social climate, healthcare, food, housing, safety, employment, and education.

The top barriers and roadblocks in the region were nonprofit and resource funding, living wage, affordable housing, substance abuse, poverty, government policies, and rural geography. Other concerns reported were healthcare access & affordability, transportation, tourism, and social issues such as bias, discrimination, fear, and a clear understanding of the issues that impact health.
